The implementation of RISE with SAP will allow Gulftainer to integrate advanced analytics, machine learning and robotic process automation, enhancing operational efficiency and decision-making.

This technology shift is also aimed at reducing operational costs, improving time to market and supporting the company's environmental objectives by incorporating sustainability processes directly into their operations.

The logistics sector in Saudi Arabia is poised for significant growth, with its market size projected to exceed USD 25 billion in 2024, as per a Mordor Intelligence report. Saudi Arabia has made a substantial leap in the Logistics Performance Index by the World Bank, climbing 17 places from 55th to 38th. Momentum Logistics is well-placed in Dammam and Jeddah to leverage the evolving dynamics of the regional logistics landscape and contribute to the



region's economic growth, supported by Gulftainer's tailored solutions in freight forwarding and transportation. Our advanced 12,000 sqm open yard facility in Dammam serves as a dynamic hub for container and breakbulk storage, offering secure and efficient solutions, including container repair and maintenance to ensure the safe transport of cargo. With a fleet of 70 technologically equipped trucks, Momentum Logistics ensures safety and efficiency in last-mile logistics.

A new milestone for Gulftainer and Momentum Logistics Iraq

A 55-hour operation successfully managed by our dedicated teams at Gulftainer and Momentum Logistics handled over 6,500 freight tonnes, consisting of 162 packages of oil shipment, including 14 out-of-gauge packages, at the Iraq Container Terminal. This terminal is equipped with state-of-the-art facilities and assets to handle all types of cargo.

Momentum Logistics introduced streamlined connectivity between Sharjah and China

This service provides a direct route from 'Door or Port to Sharjah Inland Container Depot,' enhancing less-than -container load (LCL) shipping connectivity between the two markets. Momentum Logistics' depot, which is bonded under Sharjah Customs for deconsolidation.


global connectivity, making it an ideal centre for servicing the Indian Ocean Rim and beyond.
