It retook the largest market share in Jeddah in April 2017.

# Gulftainer wins 'Best Technology Implementation of the year award'

Gulftainer's hard work and investment during the 2016/2017 period paid off significantly as the company won the 'Technology Implementation of the Year' category at the Logistics Middle East Awards 2017. This award recognizes the companies deploying advanced software and hardware solutions that make seamless warehouse and fleet management possible. Gulftainer was shortlisted for the successful implementation of its state-of-the-art Marine and Container Handling (MACH) Terminal Operating System (TOS) and SAP ERP implementation in 2016, which marks a major technology milestone for Gulftainer and the industry at large. Gulftainer began rolling out the MACH TOS, which it implemented in association with Tata Consultancy Services (TCS), in a phased manner across its terminals in the UAE. The customised software provides Gulftainer with computerised control and management of container storage and movement, enhancing its ability to proactively identify and solve problems. MACH TOS also contains innovative functions related to the optimisation of job orders, vehicle routing processes for container pick-up and delivery as well as the management of travel distances within the terminal.

TCS, which has extensive experience in working with port operators, said Gulftainer's MACH TOS rollout at the Sharjah Container Terminal (SCT) was achieved without a single glitch, and was the most successful implementation it has facilitated globally in a brownfield site. The Logistics Middle East Awards 2017 took place in Dubai and recognised industry players for excellence in the region's supply chain and logistics space. Other nominees in the 'Technology Implementation of the Year' category included DP World, Al Futtaim Logistics, FlyDubai Cargo, Unitechnik and Globe Express.

#### Gulftainer envisions major expansion plans in its Iraq facilities

Gulftainer expanded its operations to Iraq in 2008, making it the first international company to enter the port of Umm Qasr with a container terminal. Today, it has three facilities - Iraq Projects Terminal (IPT) and the Iraq Container Terminal (ICT) and the Umm Qasr Logistics Centre (UQLC). IPT has seen sustained investments developing into a first-class facility for general break bulk and project cargo segments. The ICT, is one of the country's most prominent container hubs and is the only terminal in Umm Qasr Port with a separate gate in and gate out of the Port, and separate scanner, providing an improved and professional handling of trucks to and from the terminal. UQLC, a fully integrated logistics services bonded facility, is one of Gulftainer's flagship projects in Iraq. Located close to the Umm Qasr Port, the centre covers an

area of 750,000 sq.m and acts as a one-stop-shop for supply chain needs. UQLC is a prime example of Gulftainer's ability to combine its ports and logistics offering through its subsidiary company Momentum Logistics, a third-party logistics (3PL) provider, which has significantly expanded its operations in Iraq and is one of the country's leading 3PL players today. Momentum's presence in Iraq has enabled Gulftainer to add considerable value to its customers through integrated supply chain management solutions. For instance, cargo can move directly from ICT into UQLC without the need for port side customs clearance. The Iraq Britain Business Council (IBBC) held its annual spring conference 2017 at the prestigious Mansion House in London in May. Titled 'Technology, Growth & Innovation' this event was a natural arena for Gulftainer to showcase its substantial investment in recent technological updates to its facilities in Umm Qasr Port. CEO, Flemming Dalgaard and Group Commercial Director, Iain Rawlinson represented Gulftainer at this insightful event. This conference is one of the most important of its kind and is the place to hear about the latest developments for expansion and redevelopment in Iraq from high-level UK and Iragi officials,

An businessmen and academics. increasingly safer investment scene. international sanctions for financial aid, and a strong drive for business and civic investment, provided a strong platform for the IBBC to draw together top experts, involved with business in Iraq, under one roof to share valuable information on the best way to drive that business forward. lain Rawlinson was a key speaker in a panel discussion on how new technologies will, and are, helping to make a significant improvement in the way business is conducted. Flemming Dalgaard met with the Honourable Deputy Transport Minister of Iraq, Abbas Imran Al Zubaidi and shared insights and hopes for the region. One encouraging piece of news the Minister shared at the event was that GE, the multinational energy giant corporation, is planning to build two massive power plants in the region this year and an additional four over the next 2-3 years. In addition to the investment prospects discussed for Iraq during the event, this was a very encouraging sign for the country and for Gulftainer's investments in Umm Qasr Port. Gulftainer continues to view the market in Iraq as one with immense potential, where it can leverage its global capabilities to develop the industry.

#### GT USA welcomes historic SpaceX Falcon 9 rocket

Gulftainer's US facility, Canaveral Cargo Terminal welcomed the first stage of the relaunched Falcon 9 rocket in April 2017. This historic event, the first mission of its kind, is seen as a breakthrough moment for the space industry. The SpaceX Falcon 9 booster launched from the Kennedy Space Centre on Thursday 30th March to deliver a commercial communications satellite, into orbit at Cape Canaveral Air Force Station. The booster then successfully landed on SpaceX's "Of Course I Still Love You" drone ship about eight minutes later. It is believed that this booster rocket will now remain at Cape Canaveral Air Force station as a piece of space history. In 2016, Gulftainer's GT USA company began its operations in the US, at Port Canaveral, with the Blue Stream Service. As the only dedicated container terminal at Port Canaveral, this facility delivered a strong performance in its first year and is well-positioned to achieve its long-term targets.

## Khorfakkan Container Terminal topped global customer rankings

While shipping markets around the world have been affected by overcapacity as well as the slowdown in China and Europe, Gulftainer is adapting to these economic volatilities and fluctuations, and continues to register a strong 5-year container throughput compound annual growth rate (CAGR) of 14% against a market CAGR of under 3%. Already renowned world-wide for its high productivity records in 2016, KCT topped global customer rankings for the most entries during the first half of 2017 including the rating for the highest number of 200+ BMPH (Berth Moves Per Hour) recorded. Technology and digitisation has been a key focus area for Gulftainer during 2016. A new Terminal Operating System (TOS) was implemented, which provides computerised control of the movement and storage of containers in and around the terminal. The system is a major development in how Khorfakkan Port operates and provides a foundation for further automation including IoT, predictive analytics and mobility. In addition, the engineering team at Khorfakkan, developed new specialised crane equipment that can reach the upper parts of the loaded deck of a ship at an accelerated pace. This equipment has enabled the company to continue to handle larger vessels in record times. These milestones have set a positive tone for the first half of the year, and Gulftainer expects to see them translate in to a growth in container volumes in 2017.
